## Two terrorists killed in Shopian encounter

Suspicious youth detained outside Army camp in Jammu

JAMMU/SRINAGAR : Two Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorists were on Sunday killed in an encounter with security forces in Shopian district, police said.  
The security forces launched a cordon and search operation in Hend Sitapur area in south Kashmir in the early hours of Sunday morning following a specific information about the presence of terrorists there, a police spokesperson said.  
He said as the forces were conducting searches, the terrorists fired upon them.  
The security forces retaliated the firing, ensuring a gunfight in which two terrorists were killed, he said.  
The bodies of the slain terrorists have been recovered and they have been identified as Javid Ahmad Bhat, a resident of Redwani Kulgam and Adil Bashir Wani, hailing from Waripora area of D H Pora in Kulgam, the spokesperson said.  
He said according to police



records, both the terrorists were affiliated with the LeT outfit.  
"They were wanted by law for their complicity in a series of terror crimes, including attack on security establishments and civilian atrocities. Several terror crime cases were registered against them," he said.  
"Bhat had a long history of terror crime records and a series of terror crime cases were registered against him for planning and executing terror attacks in the area. He was also responsible for recruiting youth from adjoining areas of Kulgam to join proscribed terror outfits," the spokesperson said.  
Similarly, Wani was also involved in several terror attacks and terror crime cases were registered against him, he said.  
The spokesperson said incriminating material, including arms and ammunition, were recovered from the site of the encounter.  
All these material have been taken in the case records for further investigation and to probe their complicity in other terror crime cases, he added. The spokesperson said with

One feared dead as 2 trucks fall into gorges  
Only stranded civilian vehicles allowed on highway

BANIHAL/JAMMU: One person was feared dead and two others injured in two separate road accidents on the Jammu-Srinagar national highway on Sunday, police said.  
The accidents took place in Jammu and Kashmir's Ramban district, they said.  
In both incidents, the truck drivers lost control over the wheels when negotiating blind curves and their vehicles skidded off the road and fell into deep gorges, a police official said.  
A truck rolled down a hill at Karool near Jaiswal bridge and fell into fast flowing Chenab river.  
The rescuers saved Umar Amin, a resident of Qazigund, while the search for driver Mohammad Shafi was on, the official said, adding he is suspected to have drowned.  
In Chanderkote area, a truck plunged into a 200-foot-deep gorge near Kunfer.

## BJP to scrap Article 370 if voted back to power: Shah

SHIMLA: BJP president Amit Shah on Sunday said the Article 370 that gives special powers to Jammu and Kashmir will be scrapped if Narendra Modi is elected as prime minister again.  
Targeting the Congress on the issue of national security, he said the Manmohan Singh-led Congress government did nothing when Pakistan beheaded five Indian soldiers but under Modi rule air strikes were



carried out in Balakot. Addressing a rally at Chogan Maidan in Himachal Pradesh's Chamba district, Shah pointed out that Congress leader Sam Pitroda

said instead of air strikes, "we should talk to terrorists".  
"If Pakistan will fire a bullet, we will reply with shell," the BJP chief said.  
He addressed two rallies in Himachal Pradesh on Sunday. Shah was campaigning in support of Kangra BJP candidate Kishan Kapoor and Hamirpur sitting MP Anurag Thakur.
